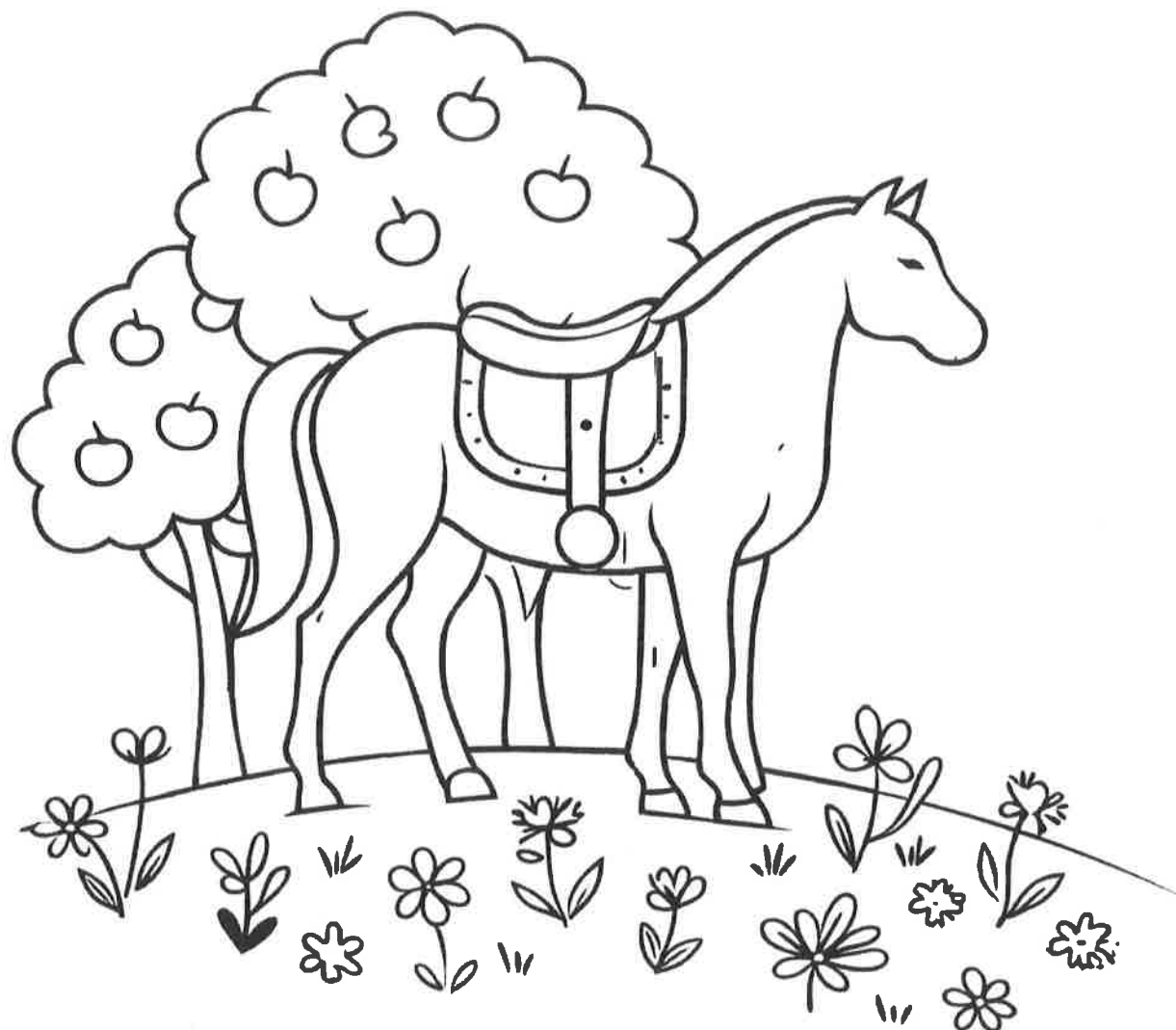

RULES & REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS:

1. An exhibit fee of \$5.00 entitles the holder to membership in the Society for the current year and to receive an admission ticket to the Fair. The Society will retain \$5.00 from all exhibitors who win \$5.00 or more, as a membership for the following year.
2. You may pick up tags at the Thrift Shop at the Coop any Saturday between 10 and 2 or at a Seguin library. Alternatively, you may contact Janet at jborneman@vianet.ca or by telephone at 705-378-1438 to make arrangements to pick up tags.
3. All exhibits must be brought to the Foley Community Centre **Thursday, September 3, 2026 between 9 a.m.- 9 p.m.** All exhibits must remain in the Hall until Sunday, and can be picked up between 10 a.m. — 2:00 pm. The Hall will be secured at all times, when unattended. Please note that if you have more than a couple of exhibits, you must be at the Hall no later than 8:30 p.m. in order to have time to process your exhibits.
4. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor to entitle them to receive a prize and must be made within the last 12 months. Articles soiled or worn are **NOT** eligible for competition.
5. No article will be permitted unless names, initials or distinguishing marks are **covered.**
6. All articles are to be handmade and must be free of all odors, including smoke, moth balls and mould. Any article with any odor will be disqualified before competition and will not be judged. No plants, flowers or vegetables with bugs will be accepted. A Board Member on behalf of the Society reserves the right to accept or reject ANY entry.
7. No persons will be admitted to the Hall during Judging except the Officers duly appointed to attend.
8. Any exhibitor removing any of their exhibits from the Hall prior to closing on Sunday will forfeit the right to prize money. Exhibits can be picked up Sunday, September 6, 2026 between 10 am and 2 pm.
9. No person shall in any way interfere with the judges or the judging.
10. If any article is entered in any class to which it does not belong, the judges

are not to award it a prize, no matter what its merits may be.

11. While the Board will take every reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of the exhibits, by entering their exhibit, the exhibit owner agrees to release and hold harmless the Foley Agricultural Society, its Directors, Officers, employees, volunteers and all others associated with the Fair and its activities in the event any exhibit is damaged, lost or stolen.
12. All judging will take place on the Friday of the Fair, in the Hall. Judge's decision is final. If only one (1) exhibit appears in a section, that exhibit does not necessarily win a prize. Prizes will be awarded on merit.
13. All exhibitors are requested to send a list of prizes and an estimate of money won, to Janet Borneman within seven (7) days following the Fair.
14. All prize money may be picked up at the **Awards Pot Luck on Saturday, September 19, 2026 at 6:00 pm.** Monies not picked up on Awards Night will be mailed in the form of a cheque, payable to the exhibitor. **Children's monies are in the form of cash and will not be mailed. Please make arrangements for pick up at another time or designate someone to pick up in your place.** Please tender all cheques on or before October 31st of the current year.
15. Claims of clerical errors must be made and received no later than five (7) days after the Fair.
16. Protests, if any, shall be made in writing to the Board and received within 48 hours of the closing of the Fair in order to be considered.
17. No selling of exhibits will be permitted.
18. Each Agricultural Society is entitled to enter a quilt in the District Competition for the "Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies". The special rules and regulations are posted on our website:

19. Only ONE (1) entry per person will be allowed under each SECTION in a Class.
20. Unless otherwise indicated, one piece will mean a unit (i.e. one dish towel);

a pair (i.e. a pair of mittens) or a set (i.e. baby booties, hat and sweater).

21. Entries in Sewing, Knitting and Crochet classes must attach a sample of the fabric/fibre/wool to the entry tag.

22. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to complete the entry form.

23. Unless otherwise stated, the prize money for children's competitions is as follows:

1st = \$2.00, 2nd = \$1.75, 3rd = \$1.50, 4th = \$1.00, 5th = \$0.75, 6th = \$0.50. 7th = \$0.25, 8th = \$ 0.25

CLASS – QUILTS

Quilts must be comprised of at least 3 layers. Quilting must be done by the person entering the quilt. A hand quilted quilt and a machine quilted quilt will be chosen from this section to compete at the District Competition. To move on to the next level of competition, each quilt must measure a minimum of 280" around the perimeter, and must be assembled and quilted solely by the exhibitor.

Grand Champion Hand Quilt - \$50

Grand Champion Machine Quilt - \$50

Grand Champion Crib Quilt - \$25

SECTION: HAND QUILTED ONLY (Entries must be SOLEY MADE AND QUILTED by the Exhibitor, unless otherwise indicated.) Quilt design must be named. Colour, design, binding, construction and overall quilting design to be judged. Embroidery and other embellishments are permitted.

1. Quilt – pieced – minimum 280" around the perimeter
2. Quilt – applique or pieced and applique
3. My 1st Hand quilting – for beginning quilter – exhibitor's choice
4. Hand quilted – quilt – crib size – ~~maximum perimeter 192"~~
5. Hand quilted – Wall hanging not to exceed 45" on any one side
6. Hand quilted – sofa cushion
7. Hand Quilted Lap Quilt maximum perimeter 280"
8. Tied quilt – no smaller than 168" perimeter
9. Memory quilt – made from recycled materials – no smaller than 168" ~~perimeter~~

MACHINE QUILTED: (Entries must be SOLEY MADE AND QUILTED by the Exhibitor, unless otherwise indicated.) (A "domestic machine" is a machine sitting on or in a table, such as a regular home sewing machine. A "long arm" is a moveable machine on a frame. "Custom Quilted" means a person other than the exhibitor has done the quilting.)

1. Quilt – pieced – domestic machine quilted – minimum 280" around the perimeter
2. Quilt – applique or pieced and applique – domestic machine quilted
3. Quilt – pieced – long arm machine

12. Quilt – pieced and /or applique – custom quilted

ANY TECHNIQUE:

1. Quilt, top only – work done solely by exhibitor – named
2. Quilt, top only – completed by 2 or more people including exhibitor – named
3. Quilt using printed panel, with custom border hand or machine quilted by exhibitor

CLASS - BAKING

Place items on a plate in clear plastic bag, plates are suggested for smaller items like cookies, pie slice or squares. Rolls are individual – Buns are attached. Muffins – no paper cups. No mixes, no canned fillings, in any product. Bread must be handmade.
